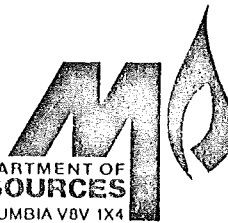




Petroleum and Natural Gas Act 1965
