

Westcoast Connector Gas Transmission

Proponent(s): Enbridge Inc.

Related Infrastructure: Undetermined

Enbridge Inc. is proposing to build an approximately 850km natural gas pipeline corridor from the Cypress area in NE BC to Ridley Island, near Prince Rupert. The proposed pipeline route will contain up to two adjacent pipelines, each capable of transporting up to 4.2 BCF/day of natural gas. Initial plans are to develop a single pipeline, with potential to include the second pipeline within the same corridor if and as commercial circumstances allow.

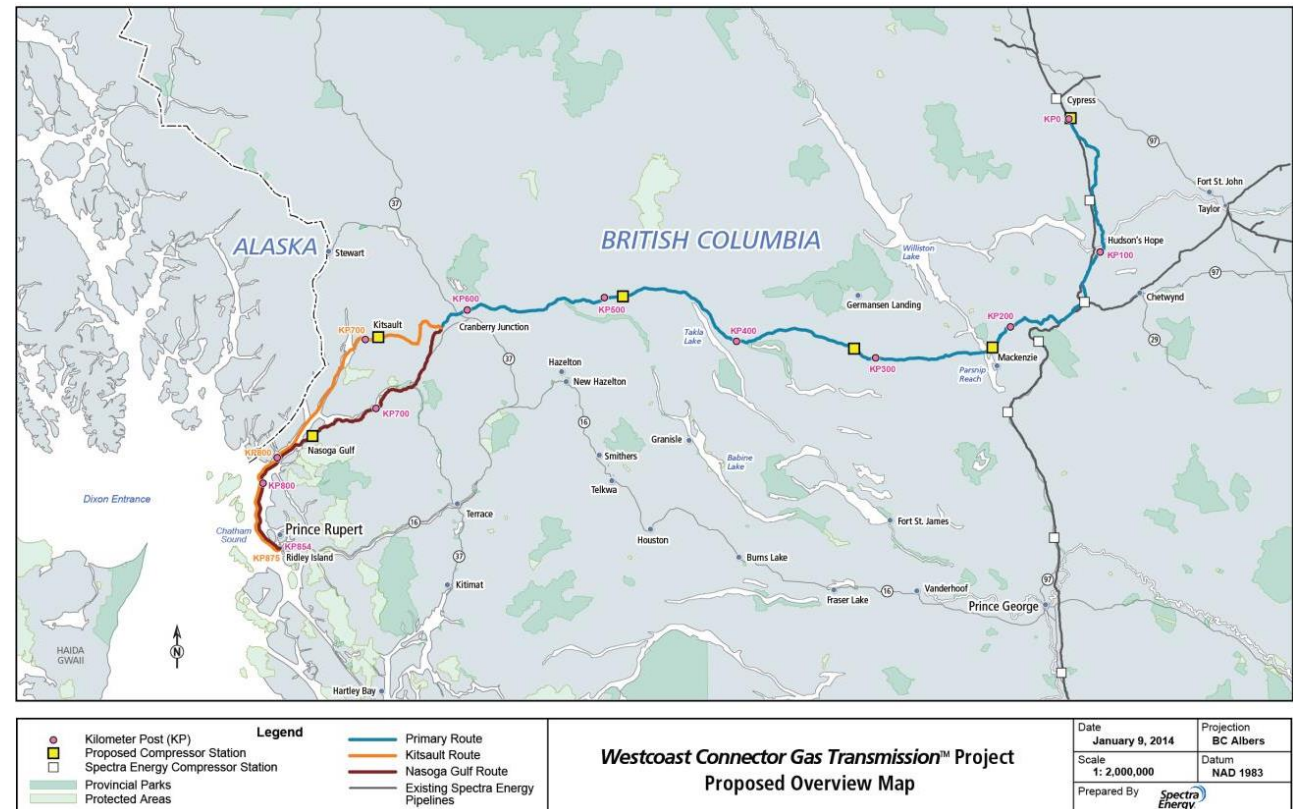

Additional Notes

- In February 2017, Enbridge Inc. announced it had merged with Spectra Energy, acquiring its assets, including this project.
- EA certificate issued November 25, 2014.
- Project considering up to two pipelines. Compressor Stations: 2 initially, with up to 5 in total. Pipe diameter is up to 48" on land sections and up to 42" in the marine portion. Maximum Operating Pressure: 14,890 kPag (2,160 psig)
- Other proposed natural gas pipelines along project route (or portion thereof) includes: Prince Rupert Gas Transmission Pipeline (TransCanada).
