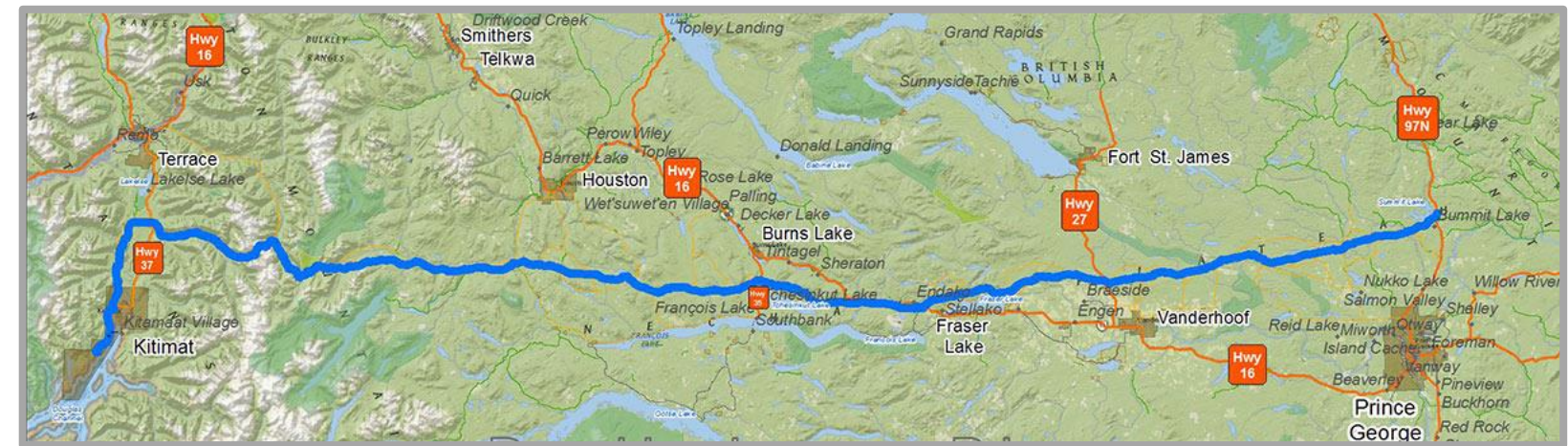


Pacific Trails Pipeline

Proponent(s): Chevron/Woodside

Related Infrastructure: Kitimat LNG Facility

The Pacific Trails Pipeline is a proposed **463-kilometre, 42-inch** natural gas pipeline that will deliver gas from Summit Lake, B.C. to the proposed Kitimat LNG facility site at Bish Cove near Kitimat. The capacity of the pipeline would be **1 BCF/day**, and includes a compressor station located at Summit Lake. The pipeline permit was applied for to the OGC in 5 segments, with Segment 1 starting in Summit Lake.

- In June 2014, TransCanada announced the Merrick Mainline Project, a 260 km pipeline from NE BC which will tie into the PTP line at Summit Lake, with an online target date of 2020.
