

Coastal GasLink Pipeline

Proponent(s): Coastal GasLink Pipeline Ltd. (a wholly owned subsidiary of TransCanada Pipelines Ltd.)

Related Infrastructure: LNG Canada Export Terminal

This proposed project involves the construction and operation of an approximately **650-kilometre, 48-inch diameter** natural gas pipeline running from near the community of Groundbirch (40 km west of Dawson Creek) to the proposed LNG Canada Export Terminal near Kitimat. The initial phase of the project would have up to two compressor stations with a capacity of **2.1 BCF/day**, with potential expansion to **5 BCF/day** and up to eight compressor stations.

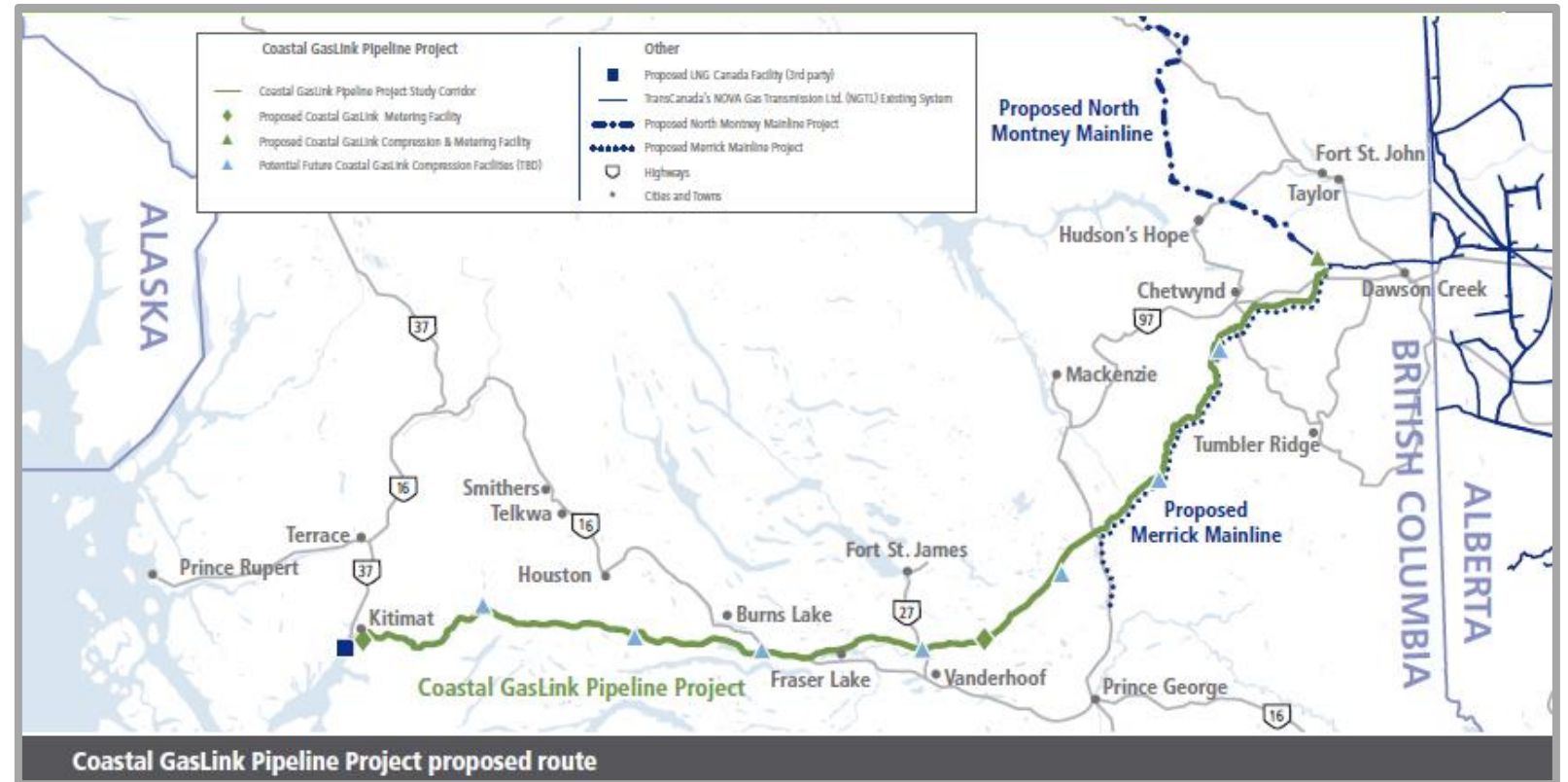

Additional Notes

- EA certificate was issued on October 24, 2014 and all primary OGAA pipeline and facility permits were issued between May 2015 – April 2016.
- The proponent’s customer, LNG Canada, announced in July 2016 to delay an FID decision on their export facility near Kitimat. As a result, CGL will also face a delay in FID.
- Compressor Stations: Up to 2 initially with up to 8 at full build out.
- Other proposed natural gas pipelines along project route (or portion thereof) include: Pacific Trails Pipeline (Chevron/Woodside) & Pacific Northern Gas Looping (Altagas).
