

IN THE MATTER of a scheme of Calahoo Petroleum Ltd. (the "Operator") for Salt Water Disposal (SWD) in the Baldonnel Formation in the well Calahoo Ft. St. John 10-35-83-18 W6M (WA 9684).

The Minister of Employment and Investment, pursuant to section 116 of the Act, hereby orders as follows:

1. The SWD scheme of the Operator for disposal of produced water in the Baldonnel Formation at well 10-35-83-18 W6M as such scheme is described in the application from the Operator to the ministry dated September 26, 1996 is hereby approved, subject to terms and conditions herein contained.
2. The water disposal interval must be in the Baldonnel Formation.
3. A record of volume of salt water disposed of through this well must be included on a Monthly Injection/Disposal Statement, in the prescribed form, which should be submitted to the Energy and Minerals Division not later than the 25th day of the month following the reported month.
4. The disposal/injection pressure at the sandface must not exceed the formation fracture pressure.
5. This approval may be modified or rescinded at a later date if deemed appropriate through a change in circumstances.
