



Changes to Inspections and Deficiencies Data in KERMIT

EFFECTIVE DATE: FEB. 16, 2018

The BC Oil and Gas Commission (Commission) is enhancing the way inspection data is recorded in the KERMIT system. These enhancements will allow the Commission to capture more data associated with inspections and deficiencies.

Changes include:

- Inspection notices for operators will include itemized details of all oil and gas activities inspected and associated findings. These notices include Inspection Reports, Second Notices, Deficiency Extension Corrections and Unacceptable Response Notices.
- The search function in KERMIT used to find inspections will be enhanced to include additional oil and gas activity types. These include Road, Geophysical, Ancillary, Changes In and About a Stream (CIAS), and Short Term Water Use (STWU). Please note, the search by location function has been moved under the activity fields listed in the Find Inspection screen.
